

Communication and Language

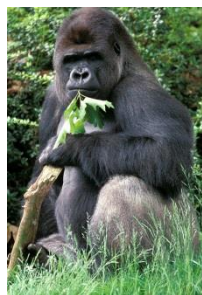
- Develop listening skills in a range of situations
